ITEMS ACCEPTED:

- Prescription Medications
- Over-the-Counter Medications
- Medication Ointments
- Medicated Shampoos
- Liquids Containing Medications
- Medicated Patches

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- Sharps / Needles
- Bio-Hazardous Materials including Wound Dressings (anything containing body fluids)
- Radioactive Medicines
- Pressurized containers or Inhalers
- Mercury
- Personal Care Products (Shampoo, Soap)
- Other Household Wastes

DISPOSAL RECOMMENDATIONS:

- For spill-free disposal, place the pills or liquid medication bottles in a zipper top plastic bag.
- Cross out any personal identifying information from labels prior to dropping them off.
- Leave the name of the medication on the label

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO SAFELY DISPOSE OF USED MEDICATIONS?

- Medications flushed down the drain or toilet can contaminate our lakes, streams, & groundwater.
- Medications disposed of into the sewer system can cause harm to humans, wildlife, and vegetation.
- Medications thrown in the trash can cause poisoning by accidental ingestion by young children, pets, and even wildlife.
- Abuse of prescription medications is the second fastest growing drug problem in America.
